This 113-acre, women-owned farm was certified organic by OEFFA in 1996. Their old, slow way of making hay has fostered habitat for threatened ground nesting birds, particularly eastern meadowlark and bobolink. Funding from the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) was used to fence cattle out of the creek, drill a water well, and bury water lines reaching all pastures for the rotationally grazed beef cattle. Part of Marshy Meadows' conserved acreage will soon be for sale, so attendees are invited to see a working farm, vibrant wildlife habitat, and explore land access possibilities.

**Directions:** From I-71 N, take exit 220 for I-271 N toward Erie and continue onto I-271 N for 25.1 miles. Keep left to stay on I-271 N, following signs for 271 N/Erie for another 9.3 miles. Take exit 34 to merge onto US-322 E/Mayfield Rd and continue for 26.9 miles. Turn left onto State Rte 534 N and take a slight right onto Noble Rd. The farm will be on the left in .5 mile.

The Tranquility Ranch is a woman-owned farm raising grass-fed sheep. They use rotational grazing practices and multi-species grazing for parasite control. This is a two-part tour that starts with a tour exploring the systems and practices of Tranquility Ranch, then is followed by a forage ID pasture walk led by Megan Burgess, state grazing specialist with the Ohio Natural Resources Conservation Service.

**Directions:** From Columbus/I-70E, take exit 132 for OH-13 toward Newark/Thornville. Turn right onto OH-13 S/Jacksontown Rd. and continue for 13.6 miles. At the traffic circle, take the first exit onto W Main St., then turn left onto OH-668 S/S Market St. and continue on OH-668 S for 4.1 miles. Turn right onto Township Rd 138 NE. The farm will be on the right in .1 mile. Follow signs.

The North End Community Improvement Collaborative (NECIC) has two large urban farms located within city limits in Mansfield. The NECIC offers a popular farmers' market, hosts middle and high school school field trips, helps with grant research, and provides hands-on apprenticeship and community engagement. They are a part of the Mansfield Microfarm Project, a community-university collaborative to create economic

development through sustainable microfarming (small-plot, high-intensity organic agriculture) in post-industrial urban spaces. Their main objective is to establish a sustainable community-based training program for aspiring beginning farmers.

**Directions:** From I-71 N, take exit 169 for Rte. 13 toward Mansfield/Bellville. Turn left onto Rte. 13 N and continue for 4.5 miles. Use the left lane to turn right onto S. Main St. Turn left onto Glessner Ave. After almost .5 mile, turn right onto Sturges Ave. Continue straight onto Bowman St. for .5 mile and the farm will be on the left.

**Parking:** Farmer and farmhands will be on site to help with parking and to direct toward the second farm site.

Shady Oaks Farm is a berry and daffodil farm started in 1997 by Chris and Leslie Burdette. Winners of the 2011 Conservation Farm Award for Putnam County, Chris and Leslie have continued to manage their farm using sustainable practices and will be certified organic in 2025. They specialize in organic blueberry container plants, daffodils, and u-pick berries. Blackberries should be ripe just in time for this tour!

**Directions:** From US-23 S, at Chillicothe take US-35 E for 88.5 miles toward West Virginia. Continue on US-35 E into West Virginia before turning left onto County Rte 817/2. After .4 mile, turn right onto WV-817 S/Winfield Rd and continue for 2.4 miles. Take a slight right onto the ramp to Eleanor/Poca and continue right onto WV-34 N for .8 mile then turn left to continue on WV-34 N for 6.9 miles. Turn right onto Manilla Creek Rd after 2.3 miles. The farm will be on the right.

**Parking:** Vehicles with all- or four-wheel drive are needed to travel up the farm's driveway. Vehicles with two-wheel drive can park at the road and people can be shuttled up the driveway.
